- Style guide for initial drafts will be general SIP language, with references, addressing SIP requirements
- Order of writing—Start with each Class I area within the state, then deal with each pollutant, in order of its importance. Certain Class I areas will require more thorough analysis, especially those impacted by out-of-state sources—Deal with in-state, then out-of-state, clustered by pollutant or attributed sources. This may vary, depending on particular states' situation.
- Combination of tables and text—look at first drafts, see what formats work best, and allow flexibility to tailor structure to best fit.
- On selecting control strategies to model—WRAP modeling will focus primarily on BART, BART-equivalent, other point source programs, and existing or near-term federal programs.
- Defining RPG is “presumptive glide path,” with 2018 as RPG for purpose of the rule. There is also the longer-term national goal of natural conditions Look again at rule language to make sure all understand

- Write simple chapters early. Where additional information is needed to complete the more difficult chapters, that can be identified as we go, and regroup.
- **Next month for first drafts, or at least outline the simple chapters, April 21st. Better drafts by May 19th. Authors will circulate pieces, as they are available.**
